Afghanistan response

Following the scenes on the news, we share your sadness at the plight of Afghan refugees. As you know from previous newsletters, we work closely with West Sussex County Council and Horsham District Council to facilitate government schemes for such refugees, the most recent of which states the UK will take 5000 Afghan refugees in the first year and 20000 in total. In these schemes, the refugees have to register and be processed, then housing will need to be found in the UK before they are offered a place. Those who have already arrived will most likely be in hotels and other temporary arrangements near the airports until housing is found. Their clothing and hygiene needs will be met by the Home Office who supervise the schemes.

Vacant housing in our area is usually the biggest hold up but I have had a number of emails this week from locals offering their support. It may take time before we start to see arrivals locally and as such **we are not collecting any donations at this time.** We will keep you updated through our newsletter system and through our Facebook group as and when we have arrivals and needs to cater for.
